

CCAP FAQ

- Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) is a government program that provides financial assistance to help families pay for child care.
- Eligible families in Cass, Hubbard, Beltrami and Clearwater counties can use CCAP dollars for Club fees. For other counties please inquire at Club.
- It can take up to 30 days for CCAP to approve or deny your application.
- After 30 days CCAP can deny your application if you missing any paperwork. You can still submit missing items at this point but the 30 days will restart.
- Double check that all required paperwork is completed before submitting application to the county office of your residence.
- Refer to the official CCAP application process for all requirements. You will be required to provide the following with your application:
 - Proof of ID for each adult in your household
 - Proof of residence (physical address)
 - Each child's age and relationship to applicant
 - Citizenship or immigration status for each child
 - If applicable, school schedule and completion date for each adult
 - Allowable deductions (Ex. insurance premiums and child support)
- CCAP might help cover the cost of fees required to become a Club member. 2020/2021 school year fees are:
 - \$125 per youth in grades 1-7
 - \$25 per youth in grades 8-12
- Parents/guardians are responsible to pay the full amount until we receive a confirmation letter from the county telling us your eligibility status for the program.
