Eclipse Holleman, 2022 Youth of the Year, shares how the Club has been a second home and family to her for over 11 years. It provided a safe and supportive place to find herself.

"My birth name is Chloe. However, at the Club, I go by Eclipse. I started to feel uncomfortable with my given name due to past traumas in my life," Eclipse shares. "The Club has given me a fresh start. It's the only place in my life where I feel safe to make this change. I knew the staff at the Club would provide the support I need to finally feel comfortable in my own name and skin."

Eclipse speaks highly of her time at the Club, especially about the guidance and encouragement she received from the staff. "From first grade and learning how to count to now working on algebra homework as a high school junior, the staff have always been there to help me succeed academically."

She also attributes Club staff, especially Morgan (pictured below) with helping her learn how to control her emotions, explore coping skills, and advocate for herself and others in need.

The next step is for Eclipse to compete in the Minnesota
Youth of the Year competition on April 26th. Eclipse has
received a \$1,000 educational scholarship by winning our local
Youth of the Year competition and plans to pursue a degree in early
childhood education or nursing. Eclipse shares, "The Club has
instilled my passion for volunteerism. I want to have a profession
that gives back to the community and others."


