Our Mights (Club members in grades 1-3) learned about different shapes and got hands-on by creating new shapes on geoboards. Older Club members in grades 4-12 really enjoy building robots, then writing code so the robots move. Hands-on learning sticks with kids, helping them build cognitive understanding and have fun. Our year-round, comprehensive garden

program is one of our most popular programs at the Club. It incorporates hydroponic growing units, high-tunnel and raised beds, and engages youth in seed-to-plate programming. These kinds of high-yield learning activities are possible through donor and grant support.

programming in Bemidji and the surrounding communities.




