When Amarachi first joined the Club three years ago, it wasn't always easy. But even early on, the now 8th grader knew she could go to Club staff for guidance and support.

"Sometimes I would just be having a really bad day, so I would go and we would just sit down and talk," Amarachi shared. "Club staff always listened to me and they were never judgmental."

Through the Club's mentorship program, Amarachi learned a great deal from Savannah Martin, who recently served as the Club's Cultural Liaison.

"Savannah taught me that some friends weren't right for me, and she held me accountable," Amarachi said. "The Club has helped me grow as a person a lot."

Since meeting Amarachi for the first time, Savannah shared how proud she's been and how she's watched Amarachi develop important skills alongside the strengths she already had.

"Communication used to be difficult for her, but now she's learned to uplift people's strengths, how to ask for help, and how to establish healthy relationships with herself and others. Clubhouse Renovation Update

The Clubhouse at 1600 Minnesota Ave is abuzz with excitement about our newly renovated space for Tweens and Teens, as well as our growing staff. In the past 12 months, local contractors tore out underutilized old locker room space that was being used as storage and created an office suite and two new bathrooms for Club members. Other underutilized spaces were modified to create **three new programming areas** which will be used to focus on (1) mentoring, arts and culture, (2) e-gaming, and (3) homework help, emotional wellness, and reading.

These updates are essential as the Club grows. When the Bemidji Clubhouse was initially built 20 years ago, the Club served 20 children and had 2 full-time staff. Now, the Club serves over 500 children annually and 14 full-time staff members.

The new office suite features eight new workstations, a kitchenette, and a bathroom with a shower. The two single-stall bathrooms for Club members provide facilities to the Tweens and Teens, a growing demographic of Club members who previously had to share one bathroom that was not near their program space. The new bathrooms, located right between the Tween and Teen program spaces, help youth spend more time engaged in Club activities.
